IN the beginning, on the first day, God created the heavens and the earth. God said, "Let there be light" and there was light. And God saw that it was good. *Blessed be the God of light.* 

In the beginning, on the second day, God created a dome to separate the waters from the waters. God called the dome sky, and saw that it was good. *Blessed be the God of Waters and Sky*.

IN the beginning, on the third day, God gathered the waters together and let dry land appear. God spoke, and the earth brought forth every color of green, and God saw that it was good.

Blessed be the God of Green-Brown Earth.

In the beginning, on the fourth day, God created the sun, the moon and the stars, to separate day from night, to mark the seasons. And God saw that it was good. *Blessed be the God of the Heavens and of Time.* 

In the beginning, on the fifth day, God created all the living creatures of sea and sky, and blessed them, and called them good. *Blessed be the God of Wing and flight, of Soaring and Swimming.*
