## The Lessons

<u>\*1<sup>st</sup> reading: Creation A Congregational Reading</u> (Liturgy for the Whole Church: Multigenerational Resources for Worship, by Susan K. Brock)

IN the beginning, on the first day, God created the heavens and the earth. God said, "Let there be light" and there was light. And God saw that it was good. *Blessed be the God of light*.

In the beginning, on the second day, God created a dome to separate the waters from the waters. God called the dome sky, and saw that it was good. *Blessed be the God of Waters and Sky*.

IN the beginning, on the third day, God gathered the waters together and let dry land appear. God spoke, and the earth brought forth every color of green, and God saw that it was good. *Blessed be the God of Green-Brown Earth.* 

In the beginning, on the fourth day, God created the sun, the moon and the stars, to separate day from night, to mark the seasons. And God saw that it was good. *Blessed be the God of the Heavens and of Time.* 

In the beginning, on the fifth day, God created all the living creatures of sea and sky, and blessed them, and called them good.

Blessed be the God of Wing and flight, of Soaring and Swimming.

In the beginning, on the sixth day, God created the animals of the earth, and made humankind in the image of God, and God saw that it was very good. Blessed be the God of our Hearts, the God of Flesh and Souls and Loving.

In the beginning, on the seventh day, God created rest, and entered into a rest from all the work that had been done. And God saw that rest was very, very good, indeed. *Blessed be the God of Holy Rest and Play.*

*Celebrant* It is truly right, and good and joyful, to give you thanks, all-holy God, source of life and fountain of mercy. Through Jesus Christ our Lord; who on the first day of the week overcame death and the grave, and by his glorious resurrection opened to us the way of everlasting life.

Therefore, joining with Angels and Archangels and with the faithful of every generation, we lift our voices with all creation as we sing:

#### Celebrant and People Holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

#### The Celebrant continues

Blessed are you, gracious God, creator of the universe and giver of life. You formed us in your own image and called us to dwell in your infinite love.

You gave the world into our care that we might be your faithful stewards and show forth your bountiful grace. But we failed to honor your image in one another and in ourselves; we would not see your goodness in the world around us; and so we violated your creation, hurt one another, and rejected your love. Yet you never ceased to care for us, and prepared the way of salvation for all people.

Through Abraham and Sarah you called us into covenant with you. You delivered us from slavery, sustained us in the wilderness, and raised up prophets to renew your promise of salvation. Then, in the fullness of time, you sent your eternal Word, made mortal flesh in Jesus. Born into the human family, and dwelling among us, he revealed your glory. Giving himself freely to death on the cross, he triumphed over evil, opening the way of freedom and life.

On the night before he died for us, Our Savior Jesus Christ took bread, and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his friends, and said: "Take, eat: This is my Body which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

As supper was ending, Jesus took the cup of wine, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said: "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is poured out for you and for all for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

## Therefore, we proclaim the mystery of faith: *Celebrant and People: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.*

### The Celebrant continues

Remembering his death and resurrection, we now present to you from your creation this bread and this wine. By your Holy Spirit may they be for us the Body and Blood of our Savior Jesus Christ. Grant that we who share these gifts may be filled with the Holy Spirit and live as Christ's Body in the world. Bring us into the everlasting heritage of your daughters and sons, that with St. Peter and all your saints, past, present, and yet to come, we may praise your Name for ever. Through Christ and with Christ and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, to you be honor, glory, and praise, for ever and ever. *AMEN*.
