Prayers of the People (Liturgy Alive)

CHALK + BLESS YOUR CHURCH/HOME FOR EPIPHANY

This Epiphany tradition is a way of blessing all who enter, exit, and dwell in your home or church. You simply write the number of the new year and the letters C, M, and B in chalk on your door or doorframe. The letters stand for the three traditional names of the Magi in Matthew 2: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar. The letters can also be a Latin acronym for "May Christ bless this dwelling."

CHALKING THE DOORS: LITURGY FOR CHURCH/HOME

Leader: Peace be to this place, and to all who enter here. *All: Amen.*

God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only-begotten One to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this place and all who inhabit it. Fill us with the light of Christ, that our concern for others may reflect your love. We ask this through Christ our Savior. *Amen*

May all who come to our church/home this year rejoice to find Christ living among us; and may we seek and serve, in everyone we meet, that same Jesus who is your incarnate Word, now and forever. *Amen*.

Chalk the door: 20 + C + M + B + 24

The three Wise Men, Caspar [C], Melchior [M], and Balthasar [B], followed the star to Bethlehem and the child Jesus 2000 [20] and 24 [24] years ago.
